I, J. A. Montgomery, do hereby make application for a pension pursuant to the provisions of Articles 6204 to 6227, inclusive, of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925, as amended by S. B. No. 27, passed by the Forty-first Legislature at its Fifth Called Session, and all other laws of this State relating thereto.

I served as a Confederate soldier (or sailor) in the war between the States of the United States; or (that I was a soldier who under special laws of the State of Texas during said war served in organizations for the protection of the frontier against Indian raiders or Mexican marauders); or (that I was a soldier of the militia of the State of Texas who was in active service during said war).

I served honorably from the date of my enlistment until the close of the war (or until I was discharged or paroled in some military organization regularly mustered into the army or navy of the Confederate States until the surrender). I was honorably discharged or surrendered 1865 at the end of the war at Selma Alabama.

That I have been a bona fide resident of this State continuously since the 1st day of February A. D. 1867.

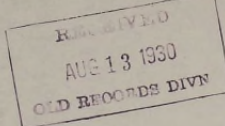

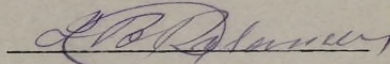

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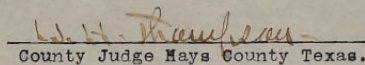

We both belonged to the same army. I know J.A.Montgomery was wounded at the fight at Coranth, after we had retreated from the battle of Shiloh where Albert Sidney Johnson was killed. I was in the cavalry and J.A.Montgomery was in the infantry. We lived in about thirty miles of each other in Alabama, and after the war closed we came to this section of Texas in the same year. 1867. "
