I, Charles Wayne Hunt, being of the age 60 years, hereby apply for membership in this Society by right of blood descent in the following line from Captain Thomas Hunt who was born in Dutchess County, New York on the 27th day of July, 1746, and died in Stillwater, New York on the 25th day of December, 1818, and who assisted in establishing American Independence. I was born in Brownsdale, Minnesota, County of Mower, State of Minnesota, on the 21st day of August, 1902.

and he, the said Captain Thomas Hunt (No. 5) is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while serving in the capacity of Sergeant, Dragoon, Second Lieutenant, First Lieutenant, in the Fourth New York Regiment of Continental Line Troops, 1776 to 1781. Then, as Captain, New York Levies, 1781 to 1784.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

Applicant affirms his adherence to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his unswerving support of the Constitution of the United States of America, to the end that the inalienable rights of the citizen may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

SACRUM 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the blood descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unflinching in his loyalty to, and rendered active service to, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, mariner, militiaman, or militia man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain. - Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Article III, Section 1, adopted June 1, 1907, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant desires eligibility by descent from more than one Revolutionary ancestor, and it is desired to file additional claims, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Applications," should be made in each case and filed with the original. State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestors, with dates of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows: THOMAS HUNT was born, we think somewhere in Dutchess County, New York, on July 27, 1746. Hamilton Child's Gazetteer of Saratoga County, New York, published about 1840,

when Thomas Hunt's youngest son Ephraim was still living on the home farm states that he was a pioneer "from Dutchess County". His war service is fully set forth in Pension Application No. W18083, Archives Building, Washington, D.C. He received Bounty Land Warrant No. 987 on July 18, 1791. He died at Stillwater on Dec. 25, 1818. Thirty years after his death, his widow Jerusha filed application for pension, two years before she died. This was granted Aug. 9, 1840, at \$416.66 per year, a good sum, retroactive to March 4, 1811. With this money the family bought the fee title to the farm, all titled prior thereto in that neighborhood being lease holds under N.Y. Law. Parts of the Thomas Hunt Family Bible are filed with the Pension Application. Enlisting first as a Sergeant in the 4th New York Continental Line, in 1775, he was promoted and commissioned Ensign in 1775, Second Lieutenant in 1776, First Lieutenant on Nov. 9, 1777, thirty days after the second battle of Bemis Heights (Saratoga), in all of which campaigns he participated and knew the terrain as if he owned it. Gates' Headquarters at the second battle was in his father-in-law's weaving house, the Ephraim Woodworth farm. The latter was in the battle as captain of the local militia company, the 4th N.Y. of 13th Regiment. On Jan. 1, 1781 the 5 New York Continental Line Regiments were consolidated into 2, and Thomas Hunt and his commander, Colonel Frederick Wesselsfels of Rye, N.Y. were supernumerary. But they then as company captain and as a commanding Colonel, joined New York State Troops (Levies) formed to clean up the western Indians. They both served as such to 1784.
