I, Herbert Hunt Knox, being of the age 60 years, hereby apply for membership in this Society by right of blood descent in the following line from Lieutenant Thomas Hunt who was born in Dutchess County, N.Y., on the 27th day of July, 1746, and died in Stillwater, New York on the 25th day of December, 1818, and who assisted in establishing American Independence.

I was born in Brownsville, Minnesota, on the 9th day of June, 1902

and he, the said Lieutenant Thomas Hunt (No. 5) is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence while acting in the capacity of Lieutenant, Fourth New York Regiment, Continental Line, to January 1, 1781, thereafter, to close of War, as Captain, New York Levies.

Lieut. N.Y. Troops

Applicant affirms his adherence to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his unequalled support of the Constitution of the United States of America, to the end that the inalienable rights of the citizen may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being at the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times untailing in his loyalty to, and rendered active service in the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, mariner, militiaman or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain.—Constitution of National Society, S.A.R., Article III

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant desires eligibility by descent from more than one Revolutionary ancestor, and it is desired to file additional claims, separate applications on special forms provided for the purpose, should be made in each case and filed with the original.

State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestors, with dates of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

Thomas Hunt was born, we know not where, on July 27, 1746. We think that it was in Dutchess County, New York, for Hamilton Child's Gazetteer of Saratoga County, New York, published when Thomas Hunt's youngest son Ephraim was still living on the old home farm, near Ketchum's Corners, Stillwater Township, Saratoga County, New York, states that he was an early pioneer from Dutchess County. His war service is fully set forth in Pension Application No. W18083, Archives Building, Washington, D.C. He received Bounty Land Warrant No. 987 on July 16, 1791, for his services. He died at Stillwater, N. Y. on December 25, 1818. His widow, Jerusha Woodworth Hunt, filed application for pension in about the year 1847, two years before she died. Pension was granted Aug. 9, 1849, \$416.66 per year retroactive to March 4, 1831. Enlisting first, in 1775, as a Sergeant in the Fourth New York Continental Regiment, he was commissioned Ensign in 1775, Second Lieutenant in 1776, First Lieutenant November 9, 1777, about a month after the second Battle of Saratoga. He distinguished himself in both Saratoga Battles, Gates' Headquarters in the Second Battle being at the farm home of his father-in-law, Ephraim Woodworth, Captain of the local militia company, 4th Company, 13th Regiment. When, on January 1, 1781, the five New York Regiments of the Continental Line were consolidated into two, he became a supernumerary, and then, under his old Commander, Colonel Frederick Weissenfels, of Rye, N. Y. became a Company Captain in New York troops.
