**ANCESTOR'S SERVICE.**

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

From New York in the Revolution  
Williams Woodworth appointed Second Lieutenant  
Oct 14 1776 and appointed First Lieutenant  
March 24 1776 in the 10th Regiment New York  
State Militia Lewis Van Nostrand Colonel  
He is named in the list of men who  
received Bounty land for services in the  
Revolutionary War  
In the history of the "Woodworth Family"  
in the Congressional Debates it is  
stated that Lieut. William Woodworth was in  
the fight at Amherst on August 17 1777  
and was engaged in the Battle around  
Saratoga N.Y. in September & October 1777.  
He is buried in the Congressional Cemetery  
N.Y. and on his gravestone he is inscribed  
his name Lieut. William Woodworth  
died March 30 1814  
Revolutionary Soldier
