I, Gilbert Woodworth Corbin, being of the age of 33 years hereby apply for membership in this Society by right of lineal descent in the following line from

William Woodworth who was born Old Plymouth Connecticut on the 4 day of January 17 35 and died in Cambridge New York on the 30 day of March 1814 and who assisted in establishing American Independence.

I was born in Philadelphia County of Philadelphia State of Pennsylvania on the 24th day of September 1904

- (1) I am the son of Milton E. Corbin born 1868, died 1924, and his wife Julia H. Woodworth born 1866, died 1903. (2) grandson of Samuel E. Woodworth born 1834, died 1904, and his wife Anna E. Davis born 1844, died 1883, married 1860. (3) great-grandson of Calvin VanK. Woodworth born 1807, died 1882, and his wife Dorothy Fitch born 1809, died 1843, married 1830. (4) great-great-grandson of Lott Woodworth born 1756, died 1840, and his wife Arenath Heath born 1768, died 1814, married 1788. (5) great-great-grandson of William Woodworth born 1758, died 1814, and his wife Mary Lott born 1744, died 1813, married 1763. (6) great-great-great-grandson of ... (7) great-great-great-great-grandson of ...

and he, the said WILLIAM WOODWORTH (No. 5.) is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Lieutenant in 16th N.Y. Regiment under command of Col. Lewis VanVoerst.

NOTE: By Constitutional Amendment adopted May 21, 1927, Article III, Section 1, quoted below, was changed so that any man of 18 years of age is eligible to membership. Former membership laws have been abolished entirely.

Applicant affirms his adherence to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his unqualified support of the Constitution of the United States of America, to the end that the inalienable rights of the citizen may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who year or all times including in his loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, mariner, militiaman, or volunteer man in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestor, with dates of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership fee, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

WILLIAM WOODWORTH - Commissioned 2d Lieutenant Oct 17, 1775 in 5th Regt. - Charlotte - Excised - First Lieutenant in the 16th Cambridge Regiment under Col. Lewis Van Voerst and was with General Stark in his operations against Bennington and with General Gates at Saratoga in 1777 - First Lieutenant in Col. David Sutherland's Dutchess Co. Regiment - Received certificates Nos. 24643 and 24647 for services performed in the regiment commanded by Col. Lewis Van Voerst.
